One of the most important qualities of an Architect is to see the potential of the place, see the resources that are already there, buildings, landscape, vegetation, materials, climate conditions, infrastructure,, this course will do exactly that, see the potential of the place, map it and create something new with what is already there.

The most sustainable thing is to find material on a site, recycle it, make it available for a new construction on the same site.

What can we build without using new resources, transforming a place in a sustainable way. Adding, making new things without burdening the environment.

The starting point is a small farm outside Trondheim, idyllically located by a lake. There are several buildings that are not in use and partly disintegrating, we will dismantle the old barn and see what of the material is suitable for reuse. We will record material, sort and make available for reuse.

We will create a new temporary building that will protect the newly recovered material and make it easily accessible for a new project.

We will pitch our tents at "Laugen" the small lake, live for a week in nature, make our own sanitary facilities, work and eat together in a small improvised camp.
