Basic info

The Dept. of Architecture was founded in 1999 and it offers a 5 year integrated program in Architecture organized in 10 semesters.

The Dept. of Architecture has adopted the European Credit Transfer System (ECTS units) as a means to support mobility and to calculate the students' workload. The full time study provides 30 ECTS each semester and 300 ECTS for the whole program.

Curriculum Structure

The curriculum contains compulsory and elective courses.

- A. During the first 2 years the curriculum aims at providing a basic architectural, theoretical and technical knowledge. All courses are compulsory.
- B. During the 3rd and 4th year of studies the curriculum aims at revealing spatial complexities creating insights and deepening the basic knowledge. Courses are compulsory and electives.
- C. The 5th year aggregates and combines the so far acquired knowledge. The 9th semester mainly contains a theoretical project (Research project) and an interdisciplinary design studio. The 10th semester is dedicated to the final Diploma project.

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Students are able to choose courses from other Departments of the UTH, such as the Dept. of Planning and Regional Development and the Dept. of History, Archaeology and Social Anthropology

Recent Curriculum Reform

In 2010 the Department proceeded to a major reform of the Curriculum. The new program has been implemented in the ac. year 2010-2011

This action was the result of the first internal evaluation report in 2008 which clarified and quantified a number of curriculum problems.

The new program:

- 1. reconsidered the courses' workload and redefined the ECTS for some of them.
- 2. Reduced the number of courses required for graduation from 69 to 56
- 3. Enhanced the cooperation with other UTH Departments sharing elective courses

Reform Results and difficulties

The reduction of the number of courses reduced the graduation length of studies.

On the other hand Curriculum reform creates administrative chaos as the students have the right to transfer courses from year to year (National regulation, ministry of Education)

Student Erasmus Mobility

The agreements provide 54 places for students study abroad for a semester of year.

In the previous ac. year 24 students applied for the program. This counts for the 6,85% of the active population or 4,8% of the total student population. Its a very high percentage taking in account that the mean European Erasmus mobility is 5% and the mean Greek Erasmus Mobility is much less.

The Dept. participates also in Intensive Erasmus programs (IP) as a partner or invited participant.
